Happy news! The water supply to the church was restored at approximately 2:30 pm. on Wednesday thanks to the great work done by the crew from S.W. Farrell & Sons Ltd.

There was lots of activity and noise in the parking lot today as the contractor excavated the area where the water main broke, diagnosed the problem, and then made the repairs (see picture of repaired pipe).

The contractor found an oval-shaped hole in the pipe about 2.5 x 3 inches in size. This was repaired using a metal sleeve-bracket to cover the hole. Then the bracket was securely clamped to the pipe.

The last steps in the process were to ask the City of Ottawa to turn the water back on from their end of the pipe, and then for the contractor to flush water out of the pipe to make sure things were working OK (see the fire hydrant picture). We turned on all the taps inside the building to flush out water while the hydrant testing was in progress.

Repairs to the curb adjacent to the hole and repaving of the entrance to the parking lot will take place on Thursday. We may




Prayer Circle:
