OUC's Christmas Star Shines Bright in Worship

On this first Sunday of Advent we will light our sanctuary star in memory

of founding members, Ralph and Doris Flockton. In 2011, Ralph donated the original star to remember his wife who had recently died. Because her birthday was on Christmas Eve, Rev. Glen (now retired) suggested hanging a Moravian Star in our church sanctuary through Advent, Christmas and Epiphany. It has become a central symbol in our sanctuary at this time of the year.

With his roots in the Moravian Church, Rev. Glen explains: "Originating in this German protestant denomination during the nineteenth century, stars like the one in our sanctuary were carried throughout the world by Moravian missionaries and were displayed in their churches and homes proclaiming the hope of Advent." This star was made near Bethlehem, Pennsylvania and constructed by a few OUC volunteers.




