At Orleans United Church we have suspended the long-held tradition of passing the collection plates in the pews during Sunday worship services. This is one of the changes that has occurred as a by-product of the COVID-19 pandemic public health and safety measures.

There is another way to provide financial gifts by cash or cheque on Sunday mornings for those who prefer that method of giving. Offering plates are positioned on pedestals at the entrances to the Sanctuary. Visitors and members of the congregation can leave their financial gifts in the offering plates as they enter the Sanctuary. We are very grateful for all the individuals and families who support our congregation with their financial donations.


Here are some of the other ways that you can do that:


